SBMI ACCOMPANYING FORMER ABK ABK COMING TO BP2MI DEMANDING UNPAID SALARY

The Indonesian Migrant Workers Union (SBMI) accompanied three former crew members (ABK) to complain to the Indonesian Migrant Workers Protection Agency (BP2MI) regarding the issue of unpaid wages, Monday

(29/9/2020).

The three crew members who complained to BP2MI represented 6 other crew members who had been employed on a Chinese-flagged fishing vessel and had been returned to Indonesia from Sri Lanka on August 30, 2020.

When complaining to the SBMI Tegal Branch Leadership Council (DPC), the crew admitted that their right to pay while working on the ship had not been fully paid.

"Actually, there were 14 crew members who were sent home from Sri Lanka on August 30, 2020, but only 11 people complained to us. On average, their unpaid salaries are more than IDR 20 million. There are even ABK who have not paid their salary right of Rp. 41 million," said DPC SBMI Tegal management, Fredy to the editorial team sbmi.or.id, Tuesday (30/9/2020).

According to Fredy, of the 11 ABK who complained to DPC SBMI Tegal, 5 ABK cases have been resolved. The crew members, said Fredy, asked to be returned to Indonesia because they were not employed in accordance with the Sea Work Agreement (PKL) and felt exploited on board.

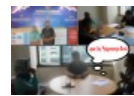

Fredy further explained that when he complained to BP2MI, his party brought 32 cases of ABK, all of which were cases of unpaid wages.

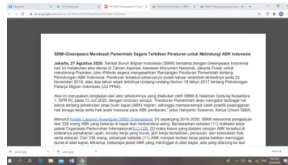
The Chairman of SBMI, Hariyanto, assessed that whatever the problem behind the crew members being sent home, their right to wages must be fully paid. According to Hariyanto, the unpaid salary of the crew members is included in the category of wage theft.

"The theft of wages is the deduction of part or all of the wages that should be the right of a crew member as stated in the Sea Work Agreement (PKL). This is often done by ship owners, ship captains, maning agencies by, among other things, not paying the agreed work wages at street vendors, not giving bonus rights that have been promised in street vendors, not giving guarantee money when repatriated due to company or party mistakes. captain / owner of the ship," explained Hariyanto
